


Make a Friend – Be A Friend – Bring a Friend to Christ

Dear Friends,

By the time you read this, the men will be just about ready for Cursillo 285, and the women will be deep into team formation for Cursillo 286. We don't have longevity by any means, but having lived Cursillos 169 & 170, it is sometimes beyond comprehension that those weekends were over 100 Cursillos ago! Praise God for that life-changing and faith-changing event in our lives so many years ago. So much time has passed since then, but always in my heart is the knowledge that without my Cursillo family I would often be a stumbling pile of mush. Thank you.

With Lent and the reminder of Jesus' suffering for us foremost in our hearts, this came to mind. I have been helping with the church laundry. Nothing labor intensive like laundering albs ... just doing the finger towels Father uses at Mass and the purificators. I asked the person who was in charge exactly how I should do the laundry. The response was ... "just pretreat the stains and throw it into the wash...". When I had everything laid out to pretreat it, I couldn't get out of my head how much the red wine stains on that white linen looked like dried blood. I heard Jesus saying ... "... of course it does. It IS." I found it impossible to just throw those cloths into the weekly laundry. Working on the stains has become a time of prayer. Ironing each of those cloths is also a bit of prayer time. Something so mundane has become something very prayerful. I suppose I should take a deeper look into my life and see that EVERYTHING that seems mundane should be prayerful.



As soon as these next 2 beautiful weekends are concluded and we usher our new family into Fourth day, it will be time to think about team formation for the Fall weekends! The cycle keeps going! Palanca Requests

“March” to the beat of a different drum. “March” madness. Beware, the ides of “March”. Processional “march”, “March” 17th, a wedding “march” or even a “march” for peace. We often hear about the word “march” (or some form of it), probably almost every day.



When I think of the word “march”, in relation to Lent, I think of the long, laborious “march” that our Lord Jesus took on Calvary. When there are programs on the Passion you sometimes hear the beat of the drum to keep Jesus and the other men on track as they walk- like a march. How difficult that would have been to watch this march, more or less walk it, carrying a heavy tree, besides. Just for a moment, put yourself at the scene. How would you have reacted on that very day? Would you have been one of the crowd saying, “Crucify him”? And as Jesus’ friend, would you have turned away and denied Jesus? I ask you to take some time this Lenten season to reflect upon His Passion. Put yourself there. Feel the anger, the helplessness, the sorrow. Then, put yourself at the foot of His cross and pray for forgiveness. He did IT, because He loves YOU.

There are 47 Cursillos in the month of March. That is up amazingly from last month alone (only 11 in Feb). Thanks be to God. Please pray for our brothers and sisters in Christ. Maybe recite the Stations of the Cross for them this month. God bless and happy Lent.

Notice to Fourth Day About upcoming Cursillo weekends at St. Francis in Tiffin

Palanca can be dropped off just inside the north entrance to the spirituality center (by the deck). There will be a box just inside the door.

Holy Hour on Saturday evening and **Apostolic Holy Hour on Sunday** will take place in St. Francis Convent chapel, next to the spirituality center. Parking is available in the stone parking lot off the drive to the right as you enter the property. Continue up the drive to the right for closer parking at the west end of the convent, or the south side of St. Francis Spirituality Center. All capable walkers and climbers are asked to enter the chapel by the outside stairs on the front side of the convent, far left(east) side).

Elderly and handicapped individuals are asked to follow the drive past the spirituality center and go around to the south parking lot. Then enter the building by the south portico door and take the elevator up to the chapel level.

There will be Fourth Day people helping to direct traffic.

Masks are required inside chapel, including while entering the building (for those using the south portico door).
